Autumn 1

Maths	Phonics	Writing
<p>Through the Mathematics Mastery programme, the children will be learning in depth numbers within 10. They will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Find one more or one less; • Find double or half of an amount; • Represent the parts and the whole in number bonds; • Add and subtract numbers within 10; • Explore commutativity in addition; • Identify 2D and 3D shapes and their properties; • Make repeating patterns using 2D shapes; • Use positional language. 	<p>Through the RWInc programme, the children will have 30 minutes of spelling, phonics and reading each morning. They will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn all 44 sounds; • Learn to blend these sounds into words; • Learn about the corresponding graphemes; • Learn 'tricky' words which cannot be sounded out; • Read phonic books which match their knowledge; • Spell words containing previously taught phonemes. 	<p>Through the Talk 4 Writing programme, the children will be focusing on texts linked to their Topic: 'Superheroes'. They will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read 'Supertato' by Sue Hendra and 'Avocado Baby' by John Burningham; • Learn to retell the stories using actions; • Use descriptive words to add detail to the main character; • Use their knowledge of the Year 1 common exception words to write simple sentences with capital letters and full stops; • Use role-play to convey thoughts and feelings; • Begin to explore a 4-part T4W structure: opening, identification of a problem, the solution and the ending.
<p>Year 1 are learning about 'Humans' this half term. They will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify the main parts of the human body; • Understand that body parts are in proportion and draw them; • Learn that each body part is associated with the following 5 senses: sight, hearing, touch, smell and taste; • Work scientifically to find out what their class' favourite foods are and make links to Mathematics through the recording of this data. 		<p>Year 1 are learning about what 'Special' means this half term. They will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify ways in which they are different and special; • Learn about special times of the year for everyone, for example birthdays, and how these can be celebrated; • Read the story of Rama and Sita and understand why it is important to Hindus; • Link the above understanding to the festival of Diwali and research ways in which it is celebrated and why.
P.E.	PSHE	Computing
<p>This year, the children will receive specialist P.E teaching through the 'Real P.E' programme. Each lesson focuses on a story which supports the learning throughout. The story for the first 3 weeks is 'I'm Riding on my Bike'. 'Pirate Adventure' is the focus for the next 3 weeks. The children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn to coordinate footwork; • Develop their balance skills; • Develop their personal skills by being encouraged to persevere and challenge themselves. 	<p>This half term, the focus is 'New Beginnings'. The children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learn what the acceptable boundaries are in school; • Learn what it means to 'belong'; • Identify what makes them happy; • Discuss how to solve problems with friends in the classroom; • Identify how they can look after their belongings; • Make cross-curricular links with R.E. 	<p>The children will continue to use programmes such as Purple Mash and Word to support their learning this half term. They will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make cross-curricular links whilst using search engines safely to research information as part of Topic; • Use Word to organise their digital content; • Learn to recognise ways in which technology can support us both in school and beyond; • Develop their understanding of e-safety.
